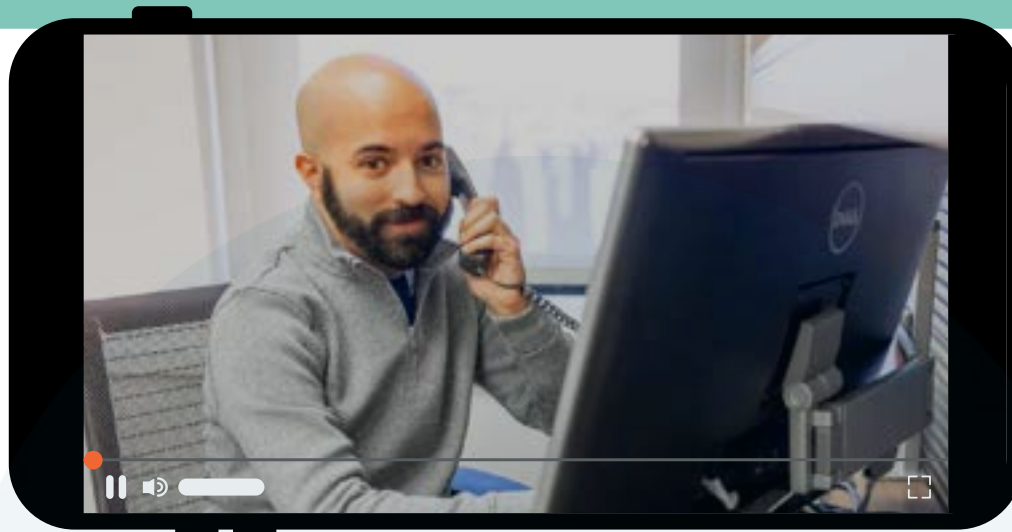

CancerCare's oncology social workers provide practical and emotional support in both English and Spanish to people diagnosed with cancer, post-treatment survivors, caregivers and the bereaved.

CancerCare's Hopeline - 800-813-HOPE (4673)

Our toll-free Hopeline provides support to anyone affected by cancer in the United States. This year, our oncology social workers and resource navigators answered **41,956** calls for people in need.

This helpline provides free professional support to patients and caregivers coping with a TNBC diagnosis in partnership with the Triple Negative Breast Cancer Foundation.

Through a partnership with the Bladder Cancer Advocacy Network (BCAN), this helpline supports bladder cancer patients, their loved ones, caregivers and those who have lost a loved one to bladder cancer.

Through a partnership with Debbie's Dream Foundation: Curing Stomach Cancer, this helpline provides dedicated support to those affected by stomach cancer, including patients, their loved ones, caregivers and the bereaved.

In partnership with Community Oncology Alliance, the Time to Screen campaign encourages adults to take charge of their health by getting recommended cancer screenings. Educational resources are available at www.timetoscreen.org and through the hotline, which helps people find local screening options.

Resource Navigation

Free resource navigation in English and Spanish is available by phone to anyone in the United States, including U.S. territories, affected by cancer. Our staff logged **1,244 sessions** with those affected by cancer through the fiscal year.



Financial & Co-Payment Assistance

Cancer's financial challenges can be overwhelming. CancerCare's financial assistance program helps with costs related to diagnosis and treatment, such as transportation, child care and co-payments. This year, we provided financial and co-payment assistance to **25,609 people**.



Support Groups

Offering safe spaces to connect with others who share their experiences and moderated by oncology social workers, CancerCare's free support groups are presented over a video platform, in-person or through a secure message board platform. This year, we hosted **59 support groups in English and Spanish**, including for post-treatment survivors, caregivers and loved ones and the bereaved.

Educational Resources

In CancerCare's Connect® Education Workshops, leaders in oncology present the latest information on treatment options, side effects, clinical trials and more. We offered **66 of these free one-hour workshops**, led by **152 experts**, supported by **76 partner organizations** and reached **36,614 participants**.



Publications

CancerCare's free fact sheets and booklets are filled with expertise on a wide variety of cancer-related topics. This year, we distributed **447,052 print and digital publications** to people affected by cancer and to health care professionals.

Website

CancerCare's website makes our free resources and programs easily accessible. This year, our website had **1.8 million visits**.

A Helping Hand Resource Guide

Our Online Helping Hand resource database offers users an extensive and up-to-date collection of resources and services for individuals affected by cancer. Hundreds of national and regional organizations are searchable by zip code and types of assistance needed. Users completed **58,780 searches** through our digital database this year.

Back-to-School Program

Going back to school can be a challenge for families dealing with cancer. To help, CancerCare's Back-to-School Program distributes backpacks full of age-appropriate school supplies to students affected by cancer in pre-K through 12th grade in the tri-state area. This year, free packages were sent to **187 students** from **67 families**.



Winter Programs

Two winter programs help families concentrate on their cancer diagnoses and treatment. For children and teens affected by cancer, the Winter Warmth Program provides warm winter accessories, while the Holiday Gift Card Program provides gift cards to help spread holiday cheer. This year, **137 children and teens received winter accessories** and **149 children and teens received gift cards**.

Healing Hearts Family Bereavement Camp

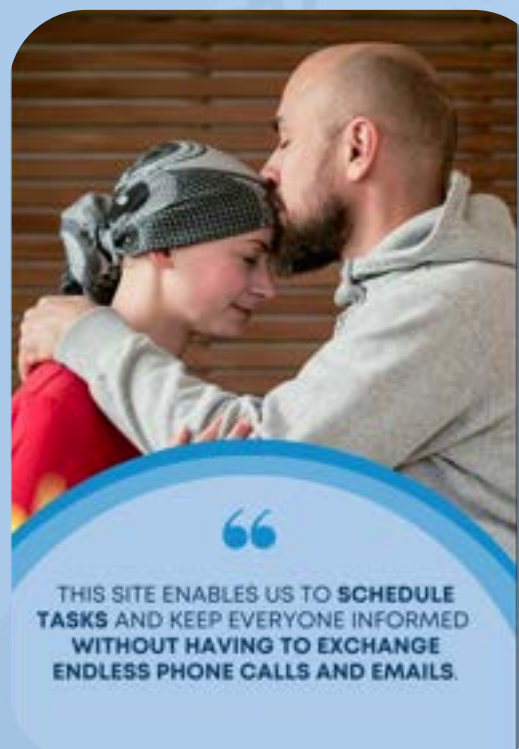

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

My Cancer Circle

My Cancer Circle allows people affected by cancer to manage day-to-day care and communicate with loved ones. Family, friends and neighbors can share updates, send reminders and organize specific tasks. This year, **46,808 users** participated in **2,303 active caregiver communities**.

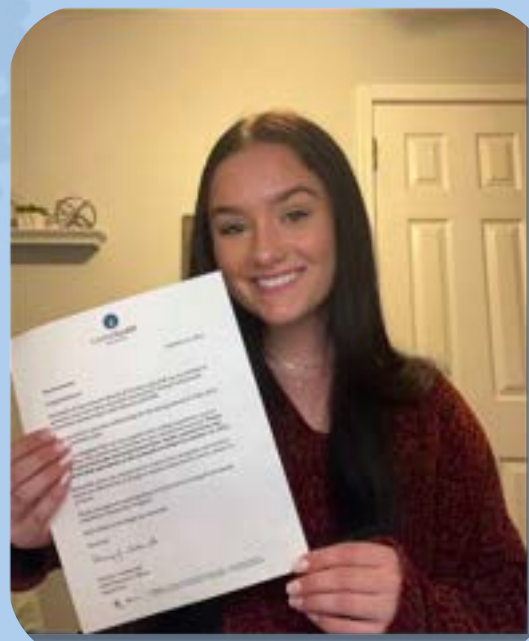


Legal Clinic

CancerCare partners with LegalHealth, a division of the New York Legal Assistance Group (NYLAG), to provide **free legal clinics in New York City for people living with cancer, caregivers and the bereaved** about their legal concerns. These are funded in part by AbbVie Pharmaceuticals.

YPC Scholarships

CancerCare's Young Professionals Committee (YPC) Scholarship Program continues to provide \$2,500 scholarships to young adult students enrolled or who will enroll in four- or six-year accredited undergraduate colleges in the U.S. who have lost a parent or guardian to cancer. Since its inception, CancerCare has awarded **\$75,000 in scholarships**.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

Coping Circle Workshops

CancerCare's Coping Circle Workshops offer free practical guidance and education about cancer topics throughout the year. In fiscal year 2025, we held **13 workshops**.

Cancer Out Loud

CancerCare's award-winning podcast features discussions about coping techniques, self-advocacy, navigating grief and more with people who have experienced cancer, whether they have been diagnosed, are caregivers or bereaved. The episodes covered topics ranging from coping with cancer as a **young adult, post-treatment survivorship, triple-negative breast cancer** and **bladder cancer diagnoses** and **bereavement**.

Pet Assistance & Wellness (PAW) Program

CancerCare offers educational resources for dog and cat owners in active treatment through CancerCare's PAW Program, along with financial assistance to offset the cost of pet food, veterinary bills, pet caregiving services and more. We helped **754 people with cancer keep their pets at home** in fiscal year 2025 and collaborated with companies to highlight our resources.

SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS

Young Adult Programs

CancerCare offers **live and online support groups, community programs and workshops** on a variety of topics to address the **unique challenges that young adults aged 18-40 face**.



Caregiver Program

Cancer caregivers receive services and resources tailored to their needs and support to process their emotions while connecting with others in similar situations. Our programs for caregivers this year included **live and online support groups, virtual workshops and in-person events**.



Older Adult Program

CancerCare presents ways for older adults affected by cancer to find support and build connections. These programs include a **live virtual support group in New York and New Jersey, virtual book and movie clubs and other community events**.

SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS

LGBTQ+ Program

CancerCare provides emotional and practical support for the **LGBTQ+ community affected by cancer**, including through safe and affirming online support groups for patients and caregivers, virtual educational workshops and publications.



Wig/Prosthesis Clinics

CancerCare's Wig Clinics **offer in-person and virtual opportunities for women with treatment-related hair loss to receive free wigs tailored to their preferences, alongside a professional wig fitter**. Our Breast Prosthesis Clinics match a trained fitter with women who have had a breast cancer-related mastectomy to try on mastectomy bras and breast prostheses and receive free mastectomy supplies. We distributed **688 total wigs and prostheses** this year.



Breast & Gynecological Cancers Program

CancerCare supports people diagnosed with **breast and gynecologic cancers and their loved ones with live and online support groups, virtual workshops and events**.

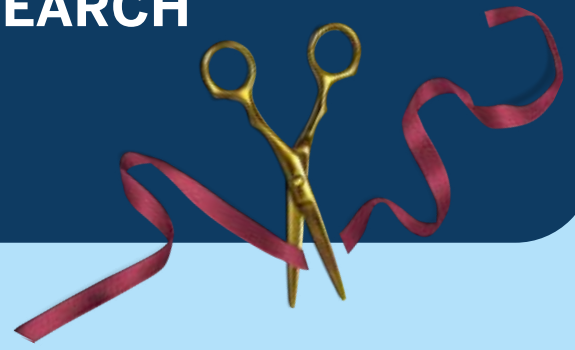
In February

RED TAPE REPORT



The Health Insurance Maze: How Cancer Patients Get Lost in the Red Tape of Utilization Management

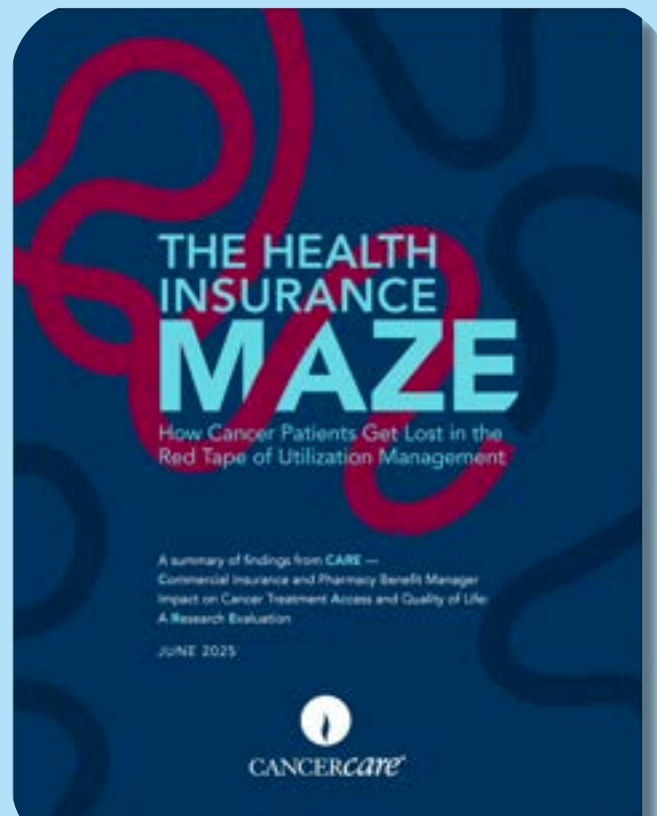
CancerCare continues to address the barriers to care caused by utilization management, a practice insurance companies use to control costs by managing how, when and whether treatments are approved. For those with cancer, these policies can cause more harm than help. Our report, **The Health Insurance Maze: How Cancer Patients Get Lost in the Red Tape of Utilization Management**, drew on a survey of 1,201 people treated for cancer to show their side of the story: how insurance red tape delays diagnosis and treatment, imposes administrative burdens, leads to costs that are unexpected and erodes trust in the healthcare system.



Our findings make clear that utilization management policies—while intended to manage costs—often create dangerous delays and stress for people fighting cancer. And in most cases, people who get insurance from their employer faced the greatest barriers.

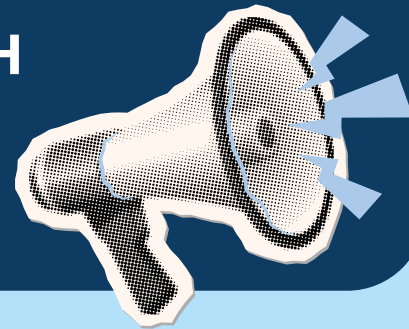

ADVOCATING FOR CLIENTS



Leading Multi-Stakeholder Education, Awareness and Advocacy on Alternative Funding Programs

CancerCare remains committed to **addressing the access challenges for life-saving and life-enhancing prescribed medications caused by Alternative Funding Programs (AFPs)**. The CancerCare-led AFP task force has grown to 34 organizations across whose communities rely on specialty medications targeted by AFPs. By sharing our AFP subject-matter expertise through presentations and panels, educational resources, patient discussions, cross-sector outreach and engagement with policymakers at the federal and state levels, CancerCare is further exposing the multiple harms caused by AFPs and working toward solutions to prevent the access barriers caused by these programs.

Keeping Patients at the Forefront of Evolving Health Care Policies

CancerCare prioritizes its policy commitment to patients across all facets of our healthcare system, as demonstrated through our work on issues such as **Pharmacy Benefit Managers, utilization management, the Inflation Reduction Act, diagnostic and biomarker testing** and the **340B Drug Pricing Program**.

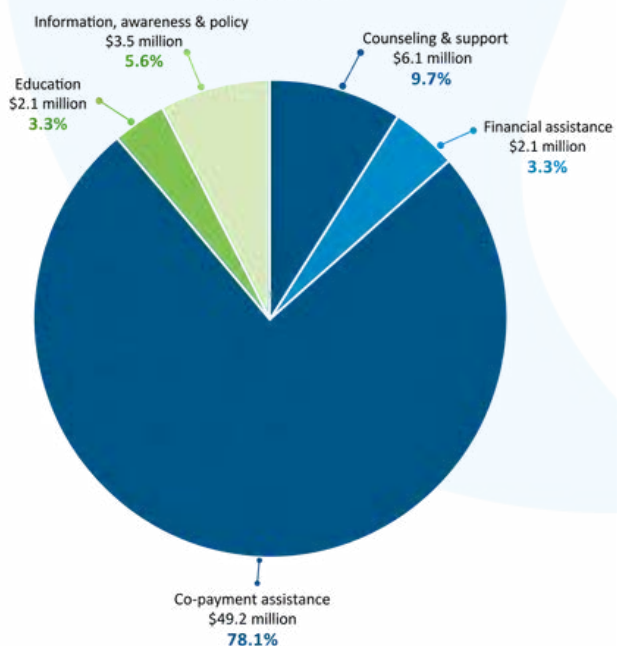
